MACRO ECONOMIC UPDATE

GLOBAL

- The Chinese Manufacturing Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) expanded in the period as it increased to 50.4pts in August 2024, up from 49.8pts in July 2024.
- In the US, the Producer Price Index (PPI), increased by 0.1% month-on-month (MoM), lower than the consensus estimate of 0.2% MoM. On a yearon-year (YoY) basis, the headline PPI increased to 2.2% in the July, down from 2.7% YoY in June 2024.
- In August 2024, NIKKEI 225 index (-1.16% MoM) and SHCOMP (-3.11% MoM) closed negative, while the S&P 500 (+2.28% MoM), EURO STOXX (+1.75% MoM), NASDAQ (+1.10% MoM) and FTSE (+0.10% MoM) ended the month on a positive note.

DOMESTIC

- In July 2024, Nigeria recorded its first disinflation of the year, with headline inflation slowing by 80 basis points (bps) to 33.40% year-over-year (YoY), down from 34.19% in June. Food inflation decreased by 134 bps to 39.53% YoY, while core inflation rose slightly by 6 bps to 27.47% YoY, up from 27.40% in June. On a month-over-month (MoM) basis, headline inflation slowed to 2.28%, down from 2.31% in June.
- The Nigerian economy grew by 3.19% YoY in Q2:2024 (vs. 2.98% YoY in Q1:2024). The economy's growth was powered by expansion in both the oil sector (+10.15% YoY in Q2:2024 vs. +5.70% YoY in Q1:2024) and non-oil sector (+2.80% YoY in Q2:2024 vs. 2.80% YoY in Q1:2024).
- The Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) released a circular operationalizing the Standing Lending Facility (SLF) asymmetric corridor and has cut the interest rate on excess deposits by commercial and merchant banks above an initial NGN3.00bn limit to 19.0%, down from 25.75%.
- The Debt Management Office (DMO) issued USD500mn domestic bond in August 2024, the first domestic dollar bond issued by Nigeria. The bond will be listed on both the NGX and FMDQ.

FIXED INCOME

Primary Market

- In August 2024, two Treasury bill auctions offered a total of NGN626.06 billion, up from NGN444.07 billion in July. The average stop rate rose to 19.70%, and the bid-to-cover ratio surged to 2.42x.
- At the August FGN bond auction, the Debt Management Office (DMO) offered NGN190 billion worth of bonds, reopening the APR-2029 (NGN70 billion), FEB-2031 (NGN70 billion), and MAY-2033 (NGN50 billion) instruments. The average stop rate declined to 20.90%, while the bid-to-cover ratio surged to 2.42x. Ultimately, the DMO sold NGN374.75 billion worth of bonds.

Secondary Market

• The Nigerian Fixed Income Market closed August 2024 on a positive note, with the average yield declining by 239bps MoM to 20.08%. Treasury Bills saw average yields rise by 397bps to 21.21%, while FGN Bonds experienced a decline of 80bps MoM, bringing their average yield to 18.96%.

EQUITIES

- The NGX All Share Index (NGX ASI) lost 1.22% MoM to print at 96,580.01 points (vs. July 2024: -2.28% MoM to 97,774.22 points), marking the second consecutive month of negative close. Following this, the NGXASI year-to-date return (YtD) declined further to 29.16% (vs. 30.76% YtD in July 2024).
- In August 2024, the Oil and Gas (+22.39% MoM), Insurance (+11.46% MoM), Banking (+6.96% MoM) and Consumer Goods (+4.30% MoM) sectors closed positive, while only the Industrial Goods sector (-13.06% MoM) closed negative.






Growth of \$10,000 investment since 31/12/20 to Date



GLOBAL MARKETS

In North America, we anticipate improved traction in the capital markets as discussions about potential rate cuts dominate macroeconomic conversations. In the US, we expect a rate cut at the next FOMC meeting, which should boost the equities market and set a positive tone for September 2024.

In September 2024, we anticipate that improved trade figures from China will drive market activity in the space, despite ongoing challenges in the country's real estate sector. Conversely, we expect the Japanese market to experience a further slowdown due to the persisting macroeconomic uncertainties.

DOMESTIC MARKETS

EQUITY

In September, we expect continued profit-taking as investors continue to lock in gains. Nonetheless, we envisage that positive sentiment in the Oil and Gas sector and renewed interest in Banking should outpower the negatives from the action. Overall, we expect the market to close on a positive note.

FIXED INCOME

In September, we anticipate that factors such as financial system liquidity and the MPC's decision will influence market direction. Considering these elements, we expect a sustained slowdown in yields.
