MACRO ECONOMIC UPDATE



GLOBAL

- In December 2024, the US Fed further reduced interest rate by 25bps to 4.25%-4.5%, marking the third consecutive rate cut in 2024.
- United States' Manufacturing PMI registered 49.3% In December 2024, compared to the 48.4% recorded in November 2024.
- In Q3:2024, the UK economy remained stagnant in the period, following zero growth in the services sector. Notably, the construction sector grew by 0.7% but this was offset by a 0.4% contraction in production.
- Bank of England maintained rates at 4.75% despite inflation printing higher than the target (2.0%) level at 2.6% in November 2024.
- In December 2024, the NIKKEI 225 (+4.41% MoM), EURO STOXX 50 (+1.39% MoM), SHCOMP (+0.76% MoM), and NASDAQ (+0.48% MoM) indices closed positive, while the S&P 500 (-2.50% MoM) and FTSE 100 (-1.38% MoM) indices closed negative.

DOMESTIC

- Nigeria's headline inflation printed higher as consumer price rose to 34.60% YoY, driven by upticks in food (+77bps to 39.93% YoY) and core (+38bps to 28.75% YoY) inflation baskets. On a month-on-month (MoM) basis, headline inflation increased by 2.64%, as food inflation went higher by 2.98%. However, core inflation declined to 1.83% MoM.
- In Q3:2024, Nigeria recorded a trade surplus of NGN5.81trn, following a 16.8% QoQ increase in total exports to NGN20.49trn and a slower growth in total imports by 8.71% QoQ to NGN14.67trn.

FIXED INCOME

Primary Market

- In December 2024, the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) conducted three Treasury bill auctions, offering a total of NGN1.19trn. The average stop rate declined slightly to 19.79% from 19.92% in November 2024, while the bid-to-cover ratio increased to 3.22x, the CBN sold a total of NGN1.61trn in Treasury bills during the month.
- At the Federal Government of Nigeria (FGN) bond auction, the Debt Management Office (DMO) offered NGN120 billion in bonds, split equally between APR-2029 and FEB-2031 maturities. The average stop rate increased to 21.57%, with a bid-to-cover ratio of 2.32x. The auction raised a total of NGN211.14bn.
- The Central Bank of Nigeria conducted two OMO auctions, offering NGN1.10trn in bills. The bid-to-cover ratio surged to 3.40x, with an average stop rate of 23.97%. A total of NGN2.33trn in OMO bills was sold.

Secondary Market

- Average yields at the secondary Nigerian Treasury Bills (NT-Bills) market surged by 105bps MoM to 25.16%. In contrast, the Nigerian FGN bond market showed modest improvement, with average yields dipping 3bps MoM to 19.46%.
- Overall, the Nigerian Fixed Income market closed bearish with average yields climbing 51bps MoM to 22.31%.

EQUITIES

- The Nigerian equities market gained a significant 5.56% MoM in December 2024 (vs. -0.15% MoM in November 2024), bringing the market to a year-to-date close of 37.75%. Notably, the NGX ASI returned to 100,000 points during the month following significant buying interest in the market,
- Across the sectorial indices, the Insurance sector (+47.16% MoM) gained the highest, followed by the Oil and Gas (+13.89% MoM), Consumer Goods (+8.94% MoM), Banking (+5.99% MoM), and Industrial Goods (+1.30% MoM) sectors.

- The Fund is constituted by a trust deed and duly authorized and registered in Nigeria as a unit trust scheme under the Investments & Securities Act 1990.




AGGRESSIVE GROWTH FUND








Growth of N10,000 investment from 31/12/2020 to Date










Growth of N10,000 investment since 31/12/2020










Growth of N10,000 investment since 31/12/2020

MARKET & MACRO OUTLOOK



GLOBAL MARKETS

North America: On the global front, we anticipate heightened volatility on the back of the implementation of policies by President-elect Donald Trump following his inauguration scheduled for January. Consequently, this should drive further reassessments of policies by global central banks, taking cognizance of the likely ripple effects.

Meanwhile, the US Federal Reserve has indicated the possibility of a 50 bps interest rate cut in 2025, despite stable consumption spending. However, they remain cautious due to recent inflation readings that are still below their 2% target.

Asia: We anticipate the Bank of Japan will continue its hawkish stance, albeit at a slower pace, to strengthen the Yen amidst the uncertainty surrounding President-elect Trump's policies.

DOMESTIC MARKETS

EQUITY

In January 2025, we expect positive sentiment in the market, riding on the positive close to 2024. To buttress, we anticipate buying interests across several stocks ahead of the release of 2024FY earnings results, particularly companies that are expected to report positive results.

FIXED INCOME

In January 2025, bearish sentiment is expected to persist in fixed income as the MPC is likely to maintain its hawkish stance. However, increased liquidity could mitigate this if the CBN refrains from aggressive mop-up operations
