# MACRO ECONOMIC UPDATE



#### **GLOBAL**

- At the first FOMC meeting of the year 2025, the federal reserve maintained its key policy rate at 4.25% 4.50%
- In January 2025, the European Central Bank (ECB) lowered its key deposit rate for the fourth consecutive time, by 0.25% bringing it to 2.75% from 3%.
- In January 2025, inflation rate in the Eurozone increased to 2.5% (vs. 2,4% in December 2024). The higher level of inflation can be linked to higher energy costs within the period.
- The Bank of Japan (BoJ) hiked interest rates in January 2025 from 0.25% to 0.5%, the highest in seventeen (17) years. This comes amid rising inflation levels and a weakening yen.
- In January 2025, the EURO STOXX 50 (+7.50% MoM), FTSE 100 (+5.01% MoM), S&P 500 (+2.93% MoM) and NASDAQ (+2.40% MoM) indices closed positive while the NIKKEI 225 (-0.67% MoM) and SHCOMP (-0.37% MoM) indices closed negative.

#### **DOMESTIC**

- In December 2024, Nigeria's headline inflation increased by 20bps to 34.80% YoY (vs. 34.60% YoY in November 2024), following higher core inflation (+53bps to 29.28% YoY). However, food inflation declined by 8bps to 39.84% YoY. On a MoM basis, headline (-20bps to 2.44% MoM) and food (-32bps to 2.66% MoM) inflation rates declined, while core inflation (+41bps to 2.24% MoM) trended upwards.
- The National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) undertook a rebasing exercise to update Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and Consumer Price Index (CPI) indicators. Starting from January 2025, the base years of GDP and CPI will be revised from 2010 and 2009 each to 2019 and 2024 respectively.
- In January 2025, the NCC approved a 50% tariff hike for telecom operators starting to help players in the sector manage rising operational costs and keep the telecom industry sustainable.

# FINANCIAL MARKET UPDATE



#### **FIXED INCOME**

#### **Primary Market**

- In January 2025, the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) held two Treasury bill auctions, lowering the total offer to NGN1.04trn. The average stop rate slightly decreased to 19.57% from 19.79% in December 2024, while the bid-to-cover ratio rose to 1.92x compared to 1.76x. CBN sold a total of NGN1.27trn in Treasury bills during the month.
- At the Federal Government of Nigeria (FGN) bond auction, the Debt Management Office (DMO) offered NGN450bn in bonds, including reopening for APR-2029 (NGN100bn) and FEB-2031 (NGN150bn) maturities, along with a new issuance for JAN-2035 (NGN200bn). The average stop rate increased to 22.30%, and the bid-to-cover ratio was 1.49x. The auction raised a total of NGN606.46bn.
- The Central Bank of Nigeria held a single OMO auction during the month, offering NGN600bn at an average stop rate of 22.58%. A total of NGN1trn was sold, split between the 341-day bill (NGN500bn) and the 361-day bill (NGN500bn)

#### **Secondary Market**

- The Nigerian Fixed Income Market closed the month on a positive note, with the average yield declining by 59bps MoM to 21.86%. This was driven by a decline in NT-Bills, where the average yield dropped by 212bps MoM to 23.43%.
- However, FGN Bonds closed lower, as the average yield increased by 93bps MoM to 20.69%.

#### **EQUITIES**

- In January 2025, the Nigerian equities market gained 1.53% on MoM and YtD bases. The market's positive performance was spurred by gains in MTNN,
  TRANSCORP and ZENITHBANK offsetting losses in DANGCEM, SUNNUASSUR and JBERGER.
- Sectoral performance in January 2025 was mixed during the month, with the Banking (+9.76% MoM) and Consumer Goods (+4.47% MoM) sectors recording gains. On the flipside, the Industrial Goods (-8.52% MoM), Oil and Gas (-1.61% MoM) and Insurance (-1.10% MoM) sectors posted losses.




# Growth of N10,000 investment from 31/12/2021 to Date


# Growth of \$10,000 investment since 31/12/20 to Date

The primary objective of the Fund is to provide a steady stream of income to investors.



# MARKET & MACRO OUTLOOK



#### **GLOBAL MARKETS**

Uncertainties in the global market surrounding President Trump's new policies and the introduction of a new AI model, DeepSeek into the market were the themes of January 2025. We expect that going into February 2025, the new Trump policies, particularly concerning tariffs could have significant impact on the US and global markets. Furthermore, we could see increased investor attention on global AI stocks.

#### **DOMESTIC MARKETS**

#### **EQUITY**

In February 2025, we expect to see sustained buying interest as 2024FY earnings results continue to trickle in. However, we believe the market will also assess the outcome of the February 2025 Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting holding on the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> of February 2025.

#### **FIXED INCOME**

In February 2025, financial system liquidity is expected to increase to NGN3.34trn (vs. NGN1.61trn in January 2025). This will be driven by the maturity of NGN2.23trn in treasury bills and NGN230.46bn in bond coupons. With the upcoming MPC meeting, we expect the committee to maintain the current interest rate, which could result in lower average yields in the fixed income market.
